CARLYLE CHEERED

(Continued from page one) Dewey had already put into effect in New York what Truman has talked about doing. Senator William B. Umstead, who was unseated in the primary campaign by Broughton, took his place alongside Carlyle as the most popular figure among the dignitaries at the rally. The applause for him was vigorous. Umstead paid high tribute to Congressman Clark, who was unable to be present because he was attending a funeral, stating that "I know no man who is the intellectual superior of Bayard Clark." Other speakers followed suit with praise of the veteran Congressman. Scott's message was strikingly at variance with the love feast

talk of the other speakers. He let it be known that he expected opposition "from some of those here today" to his program. He called for a broadening of the health, welfare and educational programs and for a more adequate farm-to-market road program." On the latter score, he declared emphatically that "I shall not appoint any man to the Highway Commission who does not see eye-to-eye with me on planning a program so that school buses can run every day." Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, New Hanover and Robeson counties had representatives present.


