## USE OF THREE-CENT STAMPS IS ADVISED BY POSTMASTER

One And One-Half Cent Variety Is No Good And Two Cent Stamp Is Poor Substitute On Greeting Cards

Postmaster Burnice Russ of the Whiteville Post Office today warned against trying to mail Christmas cards this year with one and one-half cent stamps.

By way of explanation he pointed out that the postage rate on unsealed greeting cards, which travel by third class mail, was raised to 2c last January.

So don't try to mail this year's Yule greetings with 1½c stamps left over from last Christmas, he cautioned. All sorts of embarrassing things may happen.

Your mail carrier may return the cards to you stamped, "Insufficient Postage."

Or they may be held until the addressee supplies the additional postage required by the new law before the mysterious envelope—which turns out to be your "Merry Christmas" wish—may be delivered to him.

Or your cards may be shunted into the Dead Letter Office, if they're deposited at the peak of the Christmas mailing rush and they bear no return address.

To preserve your cheery Christmas cards from these indignities, the postmaster recommends sending them all by first class mail. That means with a 3c stamp—or two 1½c stamps!

First class mail rates "directory service," by which skilled post office clerks try to trace down addresses who have moved. Your card may be forwarded from one address to another. If the addressee isn't located, the card will come back to you if the envelope bears your return address.

Christmas cards carrying 2c stamps are third class mail. They must not be sealed and must not contain personal messages. Only one effort is made to deliver them. If the address proves incomplete or incorrect, your warm-hearted Christmas greetings land in the Dead Letter Office.

"One of the saddest sights on Christmas Eve," says the postmaster, "are the many undeliverable Christmas cards. Each represents a bit of lost Yuletide sentiment. Practically all are the result of carelessness. Especially illegible handwriting, inadequate addresses, and stamps that fall school. After it was over everyone stayed awhile to talk.
