The combined programs of conservation and price supports, to assure abundant, balanced production, also help to stabilize consumer prices. "Certainly this balanced abundance results in a more favorable price level to consumers," says the chairman, "than when there is far too much of one product and too little of another. If farmers were forced to resort to scarcity programs to maintain price levels it would mean that there would be too little to go around. The farm program is in fact a farmer-consumer program to assure continued, abundant, balanced producting".
