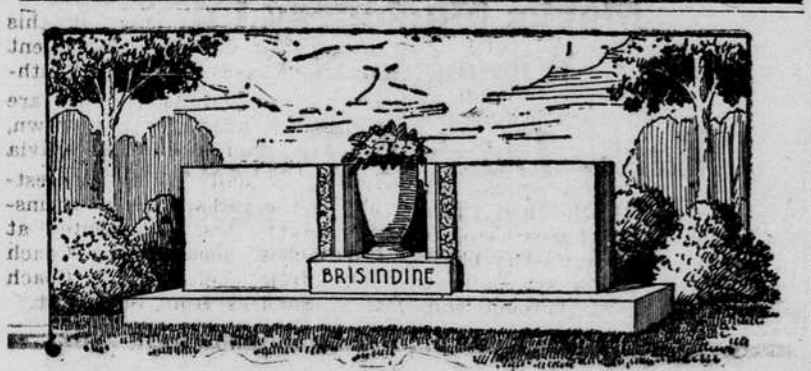

be considered as official.
If a reporter premeasures acreage unofficially, he will not be permitted to make the official determination of acreage for the farm after the crop is planted. The reporter who measures in the summer or fall will be required to certify to the county committee that he did not previously premeasure the acreage, either officially or unofficially.
Growers are requested to furnish and drive all stakes necessary to make the boundaries of the crop, such stakes to be at least 30 inches long and 2 inches in diameter. These stakes should be ready when the reporter arrives.
