Parents Watch Son Win Race

Halstead Holden First Place Winner At Camp Lejeune Saturday With Homefolk Among Spectators

Faced by a stiff wind that lowered the possibility of setting

any new time marks, the track teams of the University of North Carolina all but made a clean sweep of the Camp Lejeune Marathons at Lejeune Saturday afternoon. Carolina gathered 113 points to 18 for Lejeune.

The meet was of special local interest because Halstead Holden, son of Dr. and Mrs. R. H. Holden of Shallotte and Holden Beach, being on the Carolina track team. The young Brunswick man's speciality is the 880 yard run. In this event he came in first with about 100 feet to spare between him and Captain Magill, also of Carolina. Magill, who had previously won in the mile event and whose speciality is the two miles, was well up in his second place position ahead of Lejeune's third place man.

Sixteen events marked the meet at Lejeune, Carolina winning first in practically all of them. Among the interested spectators from Brunswick county were Dr. and Mrs. Holden, John Holden and Hobson Kirby of Shallotte and W. B. Keziah of Southport. It may be mentioned here that Halstead also won the recent 880-yard event against Princeton, a University that has a high name in track activities.

replanting needs.

Dry weather may result in a considerable number of plants being lost after they are put out in the field. Much of the crop is getting into the fields unusually early this year. Cold nights are still more than possible and the county agent points out that during such nights the cut worms often prove very destructive. It is entirely possible that a large percent of tobacco plants may be lost in one way or another after they are transplanted.
