Push Projects **Before National R&H** Congress

Dr. H. Holden And D. C. Herring Are Representing Brunswick County At Annual Session This Week

HOLDEN SEEKING INLET PROJECT

Herring Seeking Support For Breakwater Along Waterfront In City Of Southport; Both Favor Drainage

Brunswick county has been represented at the annual session of the National Congress of Rivers and Harbors this week by Dr. R. H. Holden of Shallotte and D. C. Herring of Southport.

Yesterday the North Carolina delegation met with Congressmen and Senators from North Carolina and drew from them their pledge of cooperation in pushing projects which have been outlined by the representatives to the national planning session.

Dr. Holden received recognition for the enthusiasm he has shown in developing support for the or-

During the delegation meeting in recent weeks. He asked the U.S. Army Engineers. group's support in behalf of two lower Brunswick projects, deepening and stabilization of Shallotte and Lockwood Folly Inlets.

"Our trouble at the inlets was caused by the government dredging the Inland Waterway," he said. "Everybody is sympathetic but we can't get any money for


