Panel From State Board Of Education Met Here Last Week In Advisory Capacity

Members of the Brunswick County Board of Education have voted to use the \$370,000 available for this county for basic classroom construction, and their first objective will be to standardize the three consolidated Negro high schools.

A survey committee from the State Board of Education in Raleigh was here for two days last week making a study of existing conditions.
