Soil Bank Plan Is Similar To **ACP Practices**

Both Programs Administer ed By Agricultural Stab ilization And Conserva-tion State And County

FARMERS OFFERED COST-SHARING AID

Full Information Regarding Program And Eligibility **Available At County** Office

Cost-sharing for conservation of the Agricultural Conservation Program, reported Mrs. Ada L. Varnum, ASC office Manager, this week. Both programs are Agricultural State and county committees.

"Practices for which cost-sharing is available under the conservation reserve include vegeta-tive cover, planting trees, con-structing dams, pits or ponds for storage of water", she said. "In carrying out these practices, farmers are encouraged to use ma-terial or methods which will also benefit wildlife where the conservation benefits are otherwise

Practices in the ACP include many additional conservation measures particularly adapted to local problems not included in the conservation reserve.

The cost-share rate for practices included in the conservation reserve may be as high as 80percent of the cost. The conservation reserve practices may also (Continued on Page Four)
