Hungarian Relief bers of the Board of Health pass-Channel Set Up

RALEIGH-"Citizens of North Carolina who want to sponsor Hungarian refugees are asked to channel their requests through the Governor's Advisory Com-mittee on the Refugee Relief Act," said Dr. Ellen Winston, chairman of the Committee in North Carolina.

Prospective sponsors should request the necessary forms by writing to Dr. Winston at the Raleigh. These forms, when com pleted by the sponsors, will be forwarded by the Committee to certain voluntary agencies which are aiding in the Hungarian refugee program.

Sponsors are required to provide housing, a job, and inland transportation costs for the ref-
