
Sheriff Elbert H. Gray has formally announced his candidacy he has held for the past four years. Already he has nine opponents for the Democratic nomina-

Among other things, this survey showed that usually there is a total of 4,115 students riding Members Board Of County buses in Brunswick County daily, Commissioners Sitting This 3,132 elementary and 983 high Week As Board Of Equaschool. The daily mileage of all buses generally totals 2,438 miles and 48,876 miles monthly. Of this mileage, 1,873.1 miles was reported as hard surface, 499 miles on improved roads and 66.3 miles on what was referred to in this report as unimproved roads.

The longest individual route reported in the county was at Waccamaw where Dannis Simmons drives 102 miles daily. The drivers' ages range from 16 to over 20 years, with the
