AGITATION FOR Continued From Page One are definitely in the English of that period, but the meaning is clear that provision was made for the establishment of ferry service from the Town of Brunswick to a point across the Cape Fear river known as the Haulover.

Just when the service was commenced, or how long it was continued, is not clear.

Following is the text of the minutes ordering that ferry service be provided:

"At a Genl Court of Oyer & Terminer and Genl. Goale Delivery held for the said province at the Courthouse in Edenton begun on Tuesday the twenty eighth day of March one thousand seven hundred and twenty seven and continued by adjournments to the fifth day of April following.

"It being represented to this Court that it is highly necessary that a Ferry should be settled over Cape Fear River and that part of the province not being laid out into precincts. Therefore it is by this Court order'd that the Ferry be kept for that river by Cornelius Harnett from the place design'd for a Towne on the West Side of the Iver to a place called the Haulover. And that he receive the sum of five Shillings for a man & horse and half a Crown for each person and that no person to keep any Ferry within ten miles of the said places."

500 Tree Farms Is 1959 NC Goal

Tree Farming—growing trees as a crop on taxpaying lands—got off to a fast start for 1959 in North Carolina.

The North Carolina Tree Farm committee added 30 new Tree Farms at a recent meeting here.

"This brings the total in North Carolina to 259 Tree Farms covering 1,147,450 acres of well-managed forest land growing trees for tomorrow as well as the needs of today," said J. Ray Orr, Asheville, chairman of the committee.

"The committee has set as its goal for the next meeting an additional 115 Tree Farm inspections. We hope to reach our 500th Tree Farm by our September meeting," he said.

"To qualify for Tree Farm certification, owners must protect their woodlands from fire, insects, disease and destructive grazing, while harvesting their trees as repeated crops.

"Owners who meet these qualifications and who are interested in the Tree Farm program are invited to write the North Carolina Tree Farm committee, 519 First Citizens Bank building, Raleigh. Inspecting foresters will inspect their woodlands at no charge to owners."

The North Carolina program, sponsored by the North Carolina Forest Industries Committee, is part of the industry-sponsored American Tree Farm System, active in 46 states with more than 48 million acres of well-managed timberlands enrolled.
