It was signed Susie Sellers, librarian.

George Watson, second officer aboard the S. S. Eastern Guide, was on his way to Honolulu, thence to Japan, Russia and the Philippines on a six-month cruise. The nation was to celebrate Thanksgiving on November 23, North Carolina on the 30th; our fishing editor had written on the proper method of rockfishing; and our editorial writer, basing on the "idle mind" theory, was writing with approbation on the new playground facilities in Southport.
