Farm Census In Progress Today In This County

Census Takers Will Be Making Contact With Farmers And Owners During Next Few Days

QUESTIONNAIRES IN HANDS OF FARMERS

Will Be Helpful If Farmers Have This Form Filled Out As Much As Possible Before Call

Field work in the 1959 Census of Agriculture gets underway locally on November 18 when a visiting every farm in the area, it was announced today by Field Director Joseph R. Norwood of the Census Bureau's regional office at Charlotte.

Farm census questionnaires have been mailed to all farm op-erators. The census takers will visit all local farms to collect the questionnaires and, if necessary, assist the farmer in filling out the report form.

The 1959 Census of Agriculture is the 17th in a series of nation-wide farm canvasses, the first of which was conducted in 1840. The Census of Agriculture is taken at five-year intervals to provide upto-date statistical information about the nearly five million farms which supply food and raw materials for manufacture of goods used by the people of the United States, now numbering about 178 million. The current census will yield information on the number and size of farms, acreage and harvest of crops, livestock production and inventories, selected farm facilities and equipment and selected farm ex-
