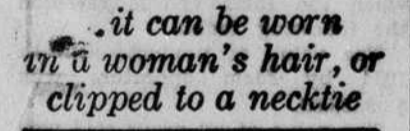

Markets Review

EDITOR'S NOTE: Following is a summary of late market price information for the week ending November 20, 1959, as gathered and edited by the Market News Service of the N. C. Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the U. S. Department of Agriculture.
The North Carolina broiler markets were a half cent per pound lower. Confirmed trading was 13 1/2 to 15 with most at 13 1/2 cents. In Georgia, offering prices were 13 1/2 to 15 1/2 but mostly 13 1/2 cents. Delmarva's market was about steady mostly 14 1/2 to 15. In Virginia, broilers closed at mostly 14 cents.

Thursday amounted to 233 1/2 million pounds for an average, so far, of 53.69.
The price of cotton declined around 30 cents per bale in Charlotte during the week. On Friday, middling 1 1/32 inch was quoted at 30.33; strict low middling at 30.33; and low middling at 27.43.
