

There was a front page picture and a feature story about the late Capt. Tommie St. George in our edition of October 23, 1935. The career of this colorful member of the Cape Fear Pilots Association extended from the days of the sailing vessels to the modern era. W. Claude Gore had been named chairman of the Brunswick county board of education, succeeding U. L. Rourk, resigned.

The first anniversary of the establishment of the CCC Camp at Southport was celebrated on the previous Saturday; Governor J. C. B. Eringhaus had ordered a special term of Superior Court; and Postmaster L. T. Yaskell had been advised by the Administration of Veteran's Affairs that burial flags were available through the post office for use of veterans who held an honorable discharge from service.

On another election year the Democratic nominee for governor appeared at a speaking engagement. The year was 1940, and the gubernatorial nominee was the late Governor J. M. Broughton. He was slated for a Friday night appearance at Shallotte, and on the following Monday night the late Wilkins P. Horton, the man Broughton defeated in the primary, was booked at Bolivia. The late H. M. Shannon had been named the first chairman of the Brunswick County Selective Service Board, and his picture appeared on the front page of our October 23, edition.
