Planting Trees Soil Practice

Brunswick County ASC Office Has Information Of Interest To Farmers Planning To Enter This Program

This is good year for Brunswick farmers to consider planting trees as a conservation practice, according to Lonnie Evans, chairman of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee for Brunswick County. Evans said figures furnished by the State Forest indicate that a good supply of seedlings will be available for planting this year. Nationally, the U. S. Forest Ser-

vice estimates there will be between two-and-a-half billion trees available for planting from state private and industrial nurseries. Almost all of these seedlings will be produced in state nurseries, the Forest Service reports.

Farmers who want cost-sharing assistance in planting trees as a conservation practice are urged to make their requests as soon as possible. The Brunswick county ASC office is accepting applications now, Evans said. He pointed out that under the Agricultural Conservation Program (ACP) the federal government shares the cost of tree planting for conservation. Costs are shared between farmers and the government on land preparation, cost of planting stock, and the actual planting costs.
