Farmers To Get Compliance News

By the time the paper is out some 1,850 notices of measured acreages will have been mailed out to Brunswick County farmers by the ASC office at Shallotte.

R. L. Price, Brunswick County ASC office manager, stated that farmers who receive "excess" notices should contact his office at once—in order to notify the office of their (the farmers') intentions.

The acreages measured are for allotted crops and feed grains. Price said that those farmers dissatisfied with their allotted measurement of any crop but tobacco, will be allowed 7 days to file a request for measurement without penalty, but that a charge of \$1 a day would be levied after that period of grace—not to exceed \$5.

Insofar as tobacco is concerned, Price stated that no request for remeasurement of the weed can be accepted after 7 days from the date of the attached notice.
