Saturday's the big day at Morehead City; the day all the sporting gentry will gather in their top hats and wading boots to watch their favorites thunder down the 16-foot track wearing the silks of twelve counties.

One of the pre-race favorites—at least in Brunswick County—will be none other than King Bruno I, fleet-clawed crab of hard demeanor and slightly bluish cast, owned by the Long Beach stables and trained by Dan Walker, town manager and sometime beach-comber, also attached to Long Beach. In cast you're a bit puzzled, the occasion is North Carolina's first crab Derby.

Currituck, Craven, Beaufort, Hyde, Onslow, Tyrell, Carteret, Pamlico and Pender counties, besides Brunswick, will have entries in the contest, which is sponsored by the Greater Morehead City C of C, with the blessing of the Tar Heel Department of Conservation and Development and the hard-shell crab-fishing industry.

According to Trainer Walker: "The other entries are nags and will prove to be alsozons who will trip over their eight legs. I have nursed King Bruno along on the choicest sea oats, spiked with all-bran and catnip. The king can't lose."

Dan refused to divulge his six-week-old racer's best time. "I did," he says dourly, "throw my stop watch away, however. You take it from there."

The great race begins at 2 p. m. on Saturday, and will be conducted on Jib Square in Morehead, located on the downtown waterfront area of the city. Prizes will be awarded those crustaceans who place, in order, first, second and third. The number one crab in all Eastern North Carolina will be entered in the National Hard Crab Derby to be conducted at Crisfield, on Maryland's fabulous Eastern Shore, September 2.

Besides the crab derby it will be a memorable two-day maritime holiday on the coast, with acrobats on water skis; concerts by the 30-piece Marine band from Cherry Point; a crab-fish Angling Contest with cash prizes with even a North Carolina "Seafood Queen" chosen.

Brunswick Men Show Winners

Kimball Jenrette And Alton Potter Both Had Prize Winning Hogs In Show In Wilmington

Kimball Jenrette of Ash and Alton Potter of Winnabow were among the winners with their breed of hogs at the seventh Annual Swine Market Show and Sale held in Wilmington last week. There were nearly 300 head of hogs in the show and according to A. S. Knowles, county agricultural agent, all graded No. 1's except 32 hogs.

Swine specialists from N. C. State College Extension Service highly commended swine farmers in Southeastern North Carolina for the quality of hogs put in the show and sale. According to sales reports these hogs sold for about 2 cents per pound above the market quotation for the day.

The purpose of the show is to give farmers in the area a chance to compare their market hogs with others so that they can improve or make change to produce the type hog preferred by consumers. Jenrette and Potter are helping lead the way to producing the meat-type hog.
