

Shark Attacks Are Analyzed

Scientists are collecting a growing number of facts on man's ancient enemy—the shark. An annual world-wide census of attacks on humans by the razor-toothed marauders is now kept at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington. Based on reports analyzed by the Shark Research Panel of the American Institute of Biological Sciences, last year's record included 30 cases of "unprovoked" assault. There are some 300 varieties of sharks, ranging from 2 to 60 feet in length, says the National Geographic Society. About a dozen are considered particularly dangerous. The "man-eater" white shark has been known to upset small boats, maiming or killing occupants. Among other sharks of ill repute are the tiger, hammerhead, mackerel, and gray nurse.

provers, the shark is equipped with a powerful jaw and mouth, studded with rows of sharp, pointed teeth. It will eat anything. Found in sharks' stomachs have been such assorted tidbits as tin cans, bricks, a fur coat, sack of coal, an alarm clock, and a full-grown dog still wearing a collar. Most sharks favor warm and temperate oceans, but some roam far north. A few inhabit tropical fresh-water lakes and rivers. Vicious sharks appear to be moving north along American shores, perhaps because of warming ocean currents. Serious attacks on swimmers have been reported off northern California and New England coasts. Casualties from shark bite may seem small compared to the millions of bathers, fishermen, and victims of shipwreck or air crash exposed to potential assault each year. But the flesh-eaters' ferocity makes them a fearsome menace.

Throughout the world, many beach owners in infested areas have dealt with the problem by setting up nets and employing lookouts to spot fins cutting the waves. Now being tried—with uncertain promise—is an antishark "bubble screen" produced by air compressors and perforated pipes. To protect men cast adrift in perilous waters during World War II, the United States Navy developed a chemical shark repellent in cake form. Carried by a downed flier or seaman, it could be dissolved in surrounding water to give off odors repugnant to sharks.

Shark Behavior Studied Since the war, oceanographers around the world have been probing the mysteries of shark behavior. As evidence mounts from laboratory and field work, the American Institute's Research Panel hopes to find clues to attacks in such factors as weather, temperatures, or the actions of prey. So far, findings are inconclu-

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Changes Made In Social Security

Moss of the Wilmington office, "farm landlords would receive social security credit for their income from the farm only if they personally were 'materially participating' in the production, or management of the production, of the crops. Now, however, a farm landlord who has an agent 'materially participating' can receive social security credit for his farm income. The agent may be a friend, relative, neighbor, or other person or firm representing the farm landlord." "As a practical matter," Mrs. Moss said, "this means that some farm owners who were previously found ineligible for social security...

as his agent, Mr. X fitted in like a glove. "What concerns us, though", Mrs. Moss went on, "is that there are many other landlords who are also eligible under the new rules.
