

Williams Defeats Waccamaw Twice

ASH—Williams Farmerette and Aggie basketball teams swept their second doubleheader of the 1962 season over the Waccamaw Eagle clubs, the Farmerettes beating the Eaglette girls, 60-34, here Monday night, and the Aggs following with a 67-54 triumph over the Eagle lads.

Heading the attack of the Columbus County clubs coached by Vernon D. Thompson were Alice Edwards with 19 points, Linda Burroughs and Sandra Wright

with 15 each, Richard Duncan with a brilliant 28-point shooting show, Robert Tyree with 15 and Frankie Granger with 10.

Best for Coach Tommy Shutt's Eagle outfits were Mary King with 21 markers, Vernon Hughes points.

with 26 and Earl Hughes with 23. Williams had earlier beaten the Brunswick County clubs, at Williams on Dec. 1 by a margin of 64-31 in girls' play; 46-32 in boys' action.

Monday night, the Farmerettes took a 22-2 quarter lead on the Eaglettes and the locals never recovered. Williams led, 29-13 and 44-24 at other turns of the girls' clash.

In the boys' game it was a different story, with the Aggies being forced to come from behind to win. Shutt's Eagles racked up a 17-13 first quarter advantage, but fell behind at the halfway mark, 26-25, due to a 13-8 second quarter margin by Williams.

Williams continued to forge ahead by 49-36 at the three-quarter mark.

Slight Injuries In 2-Car Wreck

A two-car collision injured three men early Monday morning in the Leland section of the county, sending two of the injured to a Wilmington hospital with injuries described as painful but not serious.

Highway Patrolman S. H. Thomas, who investigated the accident, said that a 1950 Plymouth being operated by Lee Blake, 50-year-old white man of Leland, RFD, headed east toward Wilmington about 7:15 a. m. and on Highway 74, collided with a 59 Ford being driven by Henry Lee Patrick, Negro, about 30, when Patrick, who was headed west toward Whiteville attempted to make a left turn in front of the approaching Plymouth.

The cars met head-on, according to Thomas. Both Blake and Patrick suffered lacerations about the head. A passenger in the Patrick car, identified as Charles Fields, complained that his arm was hurt. Thomas said Fields did not go to the hospital.

No charges were made in the accident, pending further investigation.
