

### Federal Loans Available For **County Farmers**

Shallotte Office Has Funds To Assist With Financing Farm Operations Or Re-

According to Jerry T. Murray, County Supervisor for Farmers Home Administration, 29 operating loan applications have been received from Brunswick County farmers for loans to operate their farms for 1964. There is a possibility that other farmers in the county are eligible and could profit from the use of this credit, he says.

These loans can be made to full time or part time farmers for purchase of equipment for the farm and home, livestock, feed, seed, fertilizer, refinancing debts, cash rent, purchases off feed, cost of minor real estate improvements and building repairs, and financing living cost, etc.

The amount an eligible applicant can borrow depends upon the purpose for which the loan is to be used and the overall farm oper-

The interest rate is 5 percent on the unpaid principal. Loans for annual farm and home expenses are repaid from the year's income of Gerald J. "Jack" Robinson the borrower. Loans for capital has been accepted as the new items such as tractor and equip-
