List Your Real and Personal Property Starting Monday, January 3, 1966

All property owners and tax payers are required by law to return to the List Taker for Taxation for the year 1966, all the Real Estate, Personal Property, Etc., which they own on the first day of January.

Be Sure To Bring A Complete List Of Your Personal Property.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years must list for poll tax during the same time except those exempted by law for physical disability.

All persons to whom the foregoing applies who fail to list their Real and personal Property, and/or Poll tax will be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to fine or imprisonment upon conviction.
