Computer Connects SCC With Research Triangle

As a participating institution in the North Carolina Computer Orientation Project, Southeastern Community College now is able to use a computer system in the Research Triangle Park located between Raleigh and Durham.

Southeastern is linked to the Triangle Universities Computation Center by means of a teletypewriter, which serves as a remote terminal unit. This unit will give Southeastern access to the use of the system's IBM 360 computer at the Research Triangle.

Richard Robbins, instructor in the Department of Business, will be in charge of the installation of Southeastern Community College.

In making the announcement of the tie-in with the Research Triangle's system, Dr. Robert K. Gustafson, dean of the college at Southeastern, called it "a major progressive step," and predicted the college will make good use of its allotted computer time.

Robbins said the system will be used for faculty research projects, student orientation in the use of computers along with classroom instruction, use in accounting classes, and as an introduction to data processing programs.

"We are very glad to be one of the participating colleges now," Robbins said, "and we plan to make use of the system as much as possible."

The NCCOP is part of the State Board of Higher Education, and it furnishes the teletype terminal. Jim Scoggins of the NCCOP staff will visit Southeastern Community College after the fall term begins, to give instruction in the use of the teletype terminal. He expressed the value of this service, "Smaller institutions attached to the Triangle Universities Computation Center will not only achieve computer service they could not previously afford, they will also have access to the full use of one of the most powerful university computing configurations in the country."

Altogether, 91 institutions of higher learning are eligible to participate, and so far, 31 are involved, including four other community colleges.

Nothing Tops Safe Swimming

"For guaranteed fun, nothing tops swimming."

That's the belief of Dr. H.M. McArn, Chairman of Health and Safety, of the Cape Fear Area Council, Boy Scouts of America. And he points to surveys of boys' most popular interests at camp and for year-round activities that rank swimming at the top of the list.

Dr. McArn emphasizes through, that whether swimming is for fun or fitness, people should do their swimming safely.

Safe Swim Defense is Scouting's modernized version of how to organize and supervise swimming, as Dr. McArn has been carrying the word to Scout leader's roundtables, show-and-tell events, at separate meetings and demonstrations at pools; and this summer through the nationally trained aquatics staff at Camp Tom Upchurch operated as a training center for Boy Scout troops.

"There are eight essential defenses," Dr. McArn says, "and they should apply to anyone who goes swimming--boy or girl man or woman."

The defenses, according to Dr. McArn are: (1) a responsible adult qualified in water-safety training; (2) an annual physical examination; (3) a safe swimming area marked off for three groups--nonswimmers, beginners, and swimmers; (4) capable swimmers designated as life-guard and stationed ashore--one guard for every 10 boys; (5) a lookout on the shore where he can see and hear every thing in all areas; (6) three ability groups; (7) pair every boy with another in his own ability groups; (8) maintain discipline, be strict and fair, and show no favoritism.

All the Scout Leaders who attended Summer Camp received the Safe Swim Defense coaching and commitment certificate.
