ASH — Coach Joe Best's Bolivia Bears, 1971 Brunswick County Conference baseball champions, closed out their league season here, Tuesday afternoon, with a 6-1 conquest of the Waccamaw High Eagles nine.

The triumph left Best's Bears with a perfect 6-0 record in the three-team Class 1-A loop. They are now 10-3 overall.

Bolivia's results in league play include wins over Waccamaw at Bolivia, April 14, 20-0; Waccamaw, at Bolivia again on May 6; Leland's defending champion Tigers, at Leland, on April 21, 6-0; Leland at Bolivia, April 30, 8-5; and at Leland, May 7, 4-1; plus Tuesday's win over Waccamaw here.
