Speight, Gore are candidates for Morehead awards at UNC

Charlie Edward Speight of South Brunswick High School and Emily Byrmina Gore of West Brunswick have won North Carolina Merit Awards to attend the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

The North Carolina Merit Award program, introduced in the fall of 1990, awards up to 220 one-time, \$500 scholarships annually to local students in competition for the Morehead Award.

Speight and Gore will advance to the Southeast Region competition for the Morehead Award on December 15 in Jacksonville.

"The university has reiterated its dedication to recruit the best and brightest students, and the North Carolina Merit Award is one way the Morehead Foundation can help UNC achieve the goal," said Charles E. Lovelace, Jr., executive director of the John Motley Morehead Foundation, the non-profit organization

that administers the Morehead Award program. "The purpose of the foundation is to enhance the uni-

versity by attracting the most outstanding students to enroll here. The North Carolina Merit Award program benefits every county in the state. At least one student in each county receives a Merit Award.

Speight and Gore were selected from among six high school nominees chosen earlier by area high schools. Interviews were conducted by the Brunswick County Selection Committee.

At the school and county competition levels the selection process for the North Carolina Merit Award and the Morehead Award are the same. Nominees are judged on four criteria: leadership, scholarship, character and physical vigor.

Morehead Awards provide all-expense-paid undergraduate educations at UNC. The value of an award for a North Carolina resident is more than \$40,000 for four years of study on campus and summer internships available to Morehead Scholars through the foundation's Summer Enrichment Program.

The late John Motley Morehead, III, a 1891 UNC graduate and founder of Union Carbide Corporation, established the program in 1951.

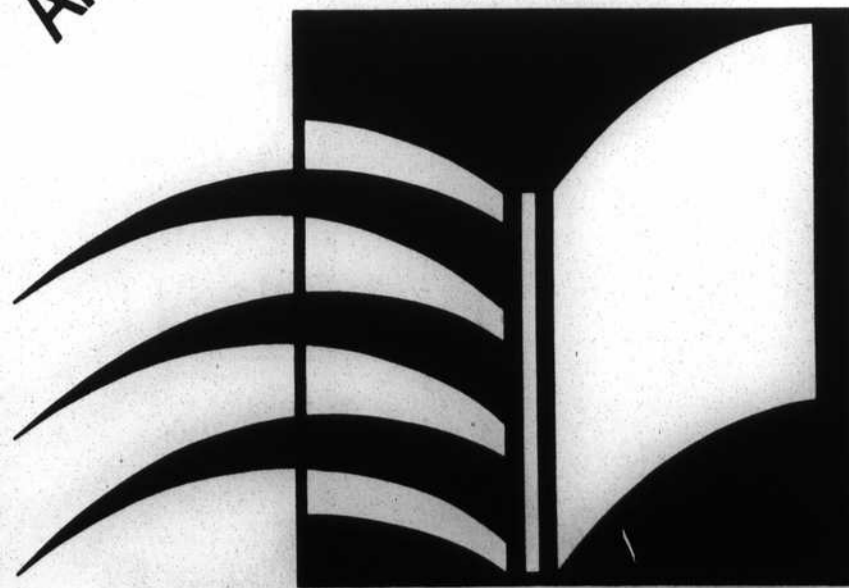
