Symphony holiday concert

The North Carolina Symphony will be in concert at 8 p.m. Monday, November 30, in Hatch Auditorium at the North Carolina Baptist Assembly, Fort Caswell.

The program will feature holiday music including Bach's "Ave Maria", Prokofiev's "Winter Bonfire", Leontovich's "Carol of the Bells" and a Christmas medley arranged by Carmen Dragon. An old-fashioned Christmas sing-along is a highlight of the concert.

Single tickets for the November 30 concert will be available at the door the evening of the concert. Prices will be \$10 for general admission and \$8 for senior citizens and students.
