Parents could pay for carelessness of youths

An uninhabited mobile home located at Tripp's Mobile Home Center at Shallotte Point was destroyed Sunday evening after being engulfed in flames, the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department reported Monday.

Detective Tom Hunter said he believes the fire was caused accidentally by three juveniles attempting to light a kerosene heater. Three boys have been identified as suspects, he said.

A neighbor reported the fire about 7 o'clock, but Hunter said the flames had probably been smoldering since about 4:30 p.m. While the juveniles may not be charged with anything, Hunter indicated that their parents may be held responsible for damages.
