## Man says cash stolen, is charged in shooting

Bolivia man allegedly went on a shooting spree inside a mobile home Saturday afternoon, Brunswick County Sheriff's Department detective Nancy Simpson reported Mon-

inflicting serious injury. He was released on bond later that day.

Simpson said Randolph went to the trailer, located on Randolphville Road near Bolivia, to purchase some used household goods. Randolph told Simpson he put his wallet on a table and later discovered that all of his money was gone.

He then allegedly picked up a .22caliber rifle and began shooting. Simpson said she wasn't sure how many shots were fired, but added, "There were shells and empty shells all over the place.'

Randolph allegedly shot Octavia Bryant, 29, once in the thigh and missed two men, who Simpson said have not been seen since the inci-

Randolph told detectives he had just been laid off and all of the cash from his last paycheck was missing from his wallet.

"He said he would have shot all of them if he could," Simpson said.
