Pressure canners, at ten pounds of pressure, get the temperature up to cer of Kernersville. 240 degrees Fahrenheit. Boiling water only reaches 212 degrees Fahrenheit. The trick is to get the food in the jars hot enough for a long enough period of time to destroy those dangerous bacteria, said Mrs. Russ. Green beans should be processed at ten pounds pressure for 20 minutes for pint-size jars, or 25 minutes for quart-size jars.

Staff members at the state historic site dressed in period costumes guide visitors around the Civil War fort which kept the port of Wilmington open to blockade runners supplying Confederate armies until the last few months of the war. The fort fell in January, 1865, after the largest naval bombardment to that time in history.
