

Privette will address ministers

Coy C. Privette, executive director of the Christian Action League of North Carolina, will be the featured speaker at the regular meeting of the Brunswick Baptist Ministers Conference on Monday, June 21, at 10:30 a.m., at Calvary Baptist Church, Shallotte.

Privette also serves as the Region VI director for North Carolina Baptist Men.

He will address area ministers concerning the gambling proposals that are currently before the N. C. General Assembly relative to a state-operated lottery and pari-mutuel gambling (horse racing with off-track betting locations), "along with other moral and ethical issues."

Lottery legislation has passed the Senate and is now in a House committee. Pari-mutuel gambling initiatives have passed a Senate panel, but the House bill is deadlocked in the House Agriculture Committee.

Privette, a native of Statesville, is a former four-term House member who represented Cabarrus, Stanly and Union counties in the 34th House District. He attended Wake Forest University and is a retired colonel from the U. S. Army Reserves with 34 years of military service. He was awarded a master of divinity degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Prior to assuming his current position he served two terms as president of the Baptist State Convention and was pastor of the North Kannapolis Baptist Church, Kannapolis, for 15 years. For eight years he has represented North Carolina Baptists on the Christian Life Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention.

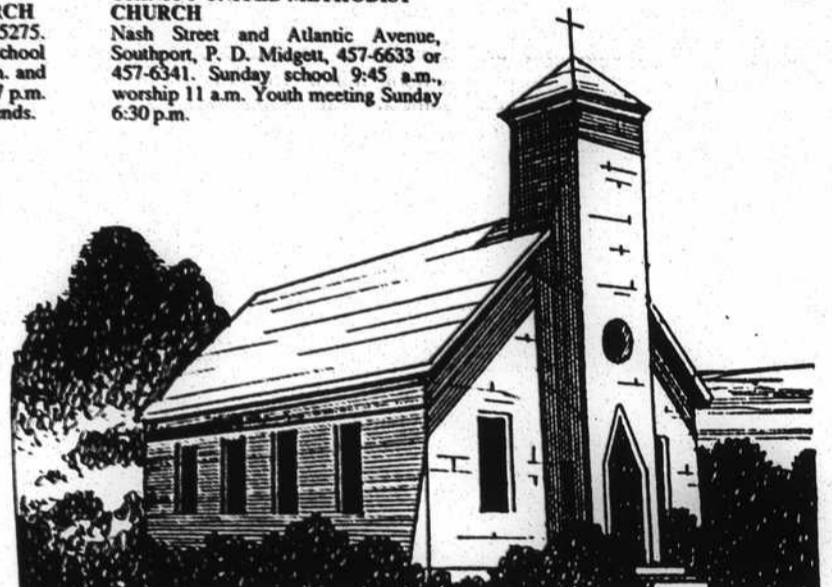
