'Section 404' seminar is scheduled August 2

Long Beach United for Progress will sponsor a seminar on Section 404 of the federal Clean Water Act Tuesday, August 2, 7:30 p.m., at the Long Beach Recreation Center.

Speakers will include G. Wayne Wright, chief of the regulatory branch of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers; Ernie Jahnke, the corps' Wilmington Regulatory Field Office manager; and Rudi Schiener, project manager for permit matters in Brunswick County.

Seminar discussions will include those on: what Section 404 of the

Clean Water Act requires; what administrative regulations require; different types of permits; coordination with other federal and state agencies; how to identify wetlands; types of activities requiring a Section 404 permit and those exempt; enforcement and remedial actions.

Wright will show slides, distribute information and answer questions at the conclusion of the presentation.
