Temporary library cards may be purchased for \$25 by out-of-county residents. The cards are valid for one year and entitle the cardholder to borrow either an unlimited number of paperbacks, three cataloged books, or one audio tape or one videotape.

County residents may obtain a library card by showing a North Carolina driver's license with a Brunswick County address, or proof of property ownership or employment in the county.

Children age six and older may obtain a library card, but youngsters under 16 must have a parent's signature on the card.

County libraries are open Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Sunday, 2 to 6 p.m. The Southport branch is located on West Moore Street; the G. V. Barbee Sr. branch is on Yaupon Drive in Yaupon Beach.
