"That was the kind of inning we needed," said coach Ward. "There were a lot of things that happened. But Josh Cumbee led that off and had a tremendous night at the plate."

In the Waccamaw 2A Conference, South remains in the battle playing .500 and will play three games in four days this week. The Cougars traveled to South Columbus on Tuesday, hosts North Brunswick on Thursday (see related story) and hosts Whiteville on Friday.

The Cougars handed Whiteville (4-1) its only loss of the season in a 3-2 game played March 16 in Whiteville. It was the first time in ten years South had defeated the baseball powerhouse.

In the big second inning against East Columbus, scoring runs for South were Cumbee, Wes Knox, Shrader, Harper and Coughlin. In the third inning, East Columbus batters grounded out and flied out before Frick struck out the third man at bat. South got a double from Knox and a single from Mintz in the third, but nothing developed like in the second and the inning ended with a double play.

"We had several guys get key hits in that inning," said Ward. "We needed that from getting shutout the other night (8-0 at West Columbus). We needed that home win to pull us back even."

In the fifth inning, Chad Dillahay relieved Frick on the mound and allowed one single, had one strikeout and two players grounded out. South responded in the bottom of the fifth by scoring a run off a Scott Grady single and another double by Cumbee that scored Eric Ottaway (running for Grady).


