Cougars face suspension, fine

argues that officials may have been right about the jersey numbers of the South Brunswick players who left the bench area -- but not about their intentions of joining the affray.

Game films also indicate actions that led up to the game-ending incident. School administrators are confident the game films they want the NCHSAA to view will clear South Brunswick from responsibility in starting the incident, but it won't likely change the outcome of the player ejections and suspensions, for the situation quickly turned ugly on both sides. The state association rules are very specific about participation in any unsportsmanlike activity or fighting and are designed to penalize players that take part in such an incident.

Player ejections carry an automatic one-game suspension, and both schools could be fined up to \$500 by the NCHSAA. That decision will come later this week. Officials decided to halt the game after the incident rather than attempt to finish it because emotions had, at that point, taken over the contest.

"I've never been involved in anything like this, not in my 14 years of coaching," said Brozy, who is in his first season as head coach at South after serving as defensive coordinator last year under Derrell Force. Brozy coached previously at 4A Raleigh Millbrook.

After the incident, Brozy's staff immediately took the six Cougar players that officials tossed from the game and placed them on the team bus away from the football field. Even the Cougar training staff on the sidelines were involved in trying to keep South Brunswick players from charging the field following other incidents that involved helmet throwing and an exchange of words

by Gators and Cougars.

The state association will review the incident this week after receiving reports from the two schools and from the officials assigned to work the game. Those officials apparently ruled in South Brunswick's favor in ending the game and awarded the Cougars with a win. It is rare that a game is stopped following a fighting incident. Brozy agreed with game officials that it was too risky to try to continue the contest, that someone might get hurt.

Two seasons ago, South Brunswick's athletic program won the 2A Sportsmanship Award from the NCHSAA for the best overall sportsmanship among all 2A schools in the state. That season, not one Cougar player was ejected from a game or contest in all of its athletic programs.

That marked a turnaround from the previous season when a football game at Pender High was marred by violence and closed with a brawl that involved both Pender players and fans as the situation got out of hand.

"I'm just disappointed in the outcome," said Brozy. "I'm not disappointed in the boys at all. I'm disappointed in the situation that arose."

South Brunswick was playing one of its best games of the season, both on offense and defense, despite the tensions and emotions. Defensive coordinator Mike Russell had designed a defense to contain East Columbus running back Kaliym Hazel, who was boxed in most of the night. He had accumulated 223 yards on 18 carries against Fairmont earlier. On offense, senior quarterback Jonathan Williams for South Brunswick was confident and had one of his best performances all season.

"We were executing what we wanted to run," said Brozy. "Jonathan did a great job in the game. He threw the ball well, and he

ran the ball well."

South Brunswick may cancel its junior varsity game scheduled for this Thursday at South Columbus since at least six of those players may be called up to play on the varsity team Friday to take the place of the six ejected players. Players can only participate in one game a week, either for the JV or varsity program.

Even if the appeals process overturns suspensions of South's six varsity starters, the Cougars are going to have their hands full against the Stallions. No team has come close to beating South Columbus all season. They are now 8-0 and on a roll.

"They are probably the best team I've seen on video," said Brozy. "They can run the ball extremely well. They run the same offense that we run. With the ejected players, it's going to make a major difference."

Last season, South Columbus set a school scoring record against the Cougars, winning the game, 62-29. The game was close at halftime, 20-14, but the Stallions scored on all six of their possessions in the second half as a stunned Cougar defensive unit saw the Stallions rack up 522 yards rushing and 42 points in the final two quarters of play
