At her home on Academy St. this city Sunday evening June 9th 1907, Mrs. T. A. Bulla peacefully passed away. Mrs. Bulla, whose maiden name was Parker, was born and raised in Guilford county this State. In 1856 she was united in marriage with the late B. B. Bulla who died in 1872. In 1859 she came with her husband to Ashboro where she has since resided. She was the mother of six children two of which a son and daughter died in infancy and the remaining four survive her. They are, J. W. Bulla of Newport News, Va. Mrs. H. L. Brower of Atlanta Ga., Miss Nanie Bulla and L. D. Bulla of Ashboro.

Mrs. Bulla was highly esteemed by all who knew her, and was a woman of rare qualities of heart and head. Never thinking of self but with a keen discernment of the needs of others, she lived for those about her and in her quiet and modest way did the work she felt that God had given her to do.

Her last fatal illness lasted less than two weeks, but it was borne with that christian fortitude characteristic of her. Surrounded by her children, as the sun was sinking toward the western horizon, the death angel closed the weary eyes and with peace written on her countenance she fell asleep forever.
