THE HALL OF FAME.

ULYSSES S. GRANT—American general, eighteenth president of United States. Born Point Pleasant, O., April 27, 1822; died Mount McGregor, N.Y., July 23, 1885. Was graduated from West Point in 1843. Served through Mexican war as officer. Left army in 1854 and settled near St. Louis. Removed to Galena, Ill., in 1860. Offered services when civil war began and was appointed colonel of Twenty-first Illinois Infantry June 17, 1861, and received commission as brigadier general at Ironton, Mo., Aug. 7. After capturing Forts Donelson and Henry early in 1862 was made major general of volunteers. After taking Vicksburg July 4, 1863, was made major general in regular army. Was made lieutenant general March 2, 1864, and commander of all the Union armies March 12. Took up headquarters with Army of the Potomac. Received surrender of Confederate General Lee at Appomattox April 9, 1865, virtually ending the war. Commissioned general July 25, 1866. Elected president on Republican ticket in 1868 and re-elected in 1872. Made tour of world 1877-9.
