**School Teachers Required to Watch Children's Health**

School teachers are now required by the State Board of Health to give a stricter watch to the children's health. This new ruling has been found very necessary by the State Board of Health to check the spread of many communicable diseases.

The regulation requires all teachers to report to the county quarantine officer when a pupil is found to have symptoms suggestive of chicken pox, diphtheria, measles, German measles, scarlet fever, septic sore throat, small pox and whooping cough, and furthermore, to exclude the child from school until the nature of the disease is determined, and if the disease is contagious, until the child is well.

The teachers can render a most effective service in controlling contagious diseases by watching carefully their pupils on their returning to school and reporting and excluding all suspected cases. They are requested by the Board to keep in touch with their county quarantine officer and to call upon him when help is needed in an outbreak of any disease.

**Farmers to Get Nitrate of Soda by Filing Application Blank with the County Agent**

County agent D. S. Colburn has received the application blanks for securing the nitrate of soda which the government is to distribute to the farmers at actual cost which in 1919 is 1 cent per pound. These application blanks will be sent to the following places and farmers may either file their application with these distributors or with the county agent, J. A. Holder, Asheboro, N. C. Union Store, Liberty, J. A. Holder, Banner, C. M. Traver, Erwin, N. C. Calhoun, Glenolt. Additional distributors will be appointed later.

Last year this county placed orders sufficient for one car of this nitrate and many farmers relied that they were certain that they made at least one third more wheat by the application of 20 pounds of nitrate of soda more than they would if they had not used it. About all corn club boys who used it made at least 50 bushels of corn the acre when 8-2-2 fertilizer is selling at nearly \$50 a ton, and sells at \$25 it is certainly better for the farmer to buy acid than buy this nitrate of soda and then use it as a fertilizer. One of the best farmers of the county has already told the county agent to book him for a ton of the nitrate, that he expected to get all of his nitrogen in this form. While \$81 a ton looks high, consider that nitrate of soda analyzes about 14% nitrogen or 14 pounds of nitrogen while 8-2-2 has only 2 pounds of nitrogen to the hundred. Then you can see that you get 40 times as much nitrogen in 100 pounds of nitrate of soda as you would get in 700 pounds of 8-2-2 fertilizer. Of course nitrate of soda is cheaper to the farmer at \$81 a ton than buying it from the fertilizer plants because they will not furnish you this soda for less than \$100 a ton. Place your orders at once. They must be in by February 1st.
