REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH The 9 counties co-operating with the State Board of Health through the es-tablishment of county health departments with whole time officers in harge come forward with the best reoort for the past month yet achieved in this work, which has shown steady progress. A total of 14,502 people vere vaccinated in the campaign against typhoid fever, and in the same period a total of 969 sanitary closets were built, these being for the most part in the rural sections of the counties. These two items are merly the igh spots in the work accomplished The educational work along health lines in these counties are summed in the following statistics: 113 public meetings held; attendance upon these meling., 11,485; letters sent out, 2,857 newspaper articles on public health
