REGISTER OF DEEDS AMICK EXPLAINS INCREASED TAX RATE

To the Tax Payers of Randolph County: My attention has been called to some dissatisfaction of the tax payers on account of the increase in the tax rate. I think it only fair to the tax payers to submit the rates for the last four years.

By comparing the foregoing rates, you will not be surprised to find that the increase in the total rate is on account of the State increase in the school rate from 20 cents in 1918 to 6 cents in 1919. The total rate amounts to only 1.00 per cent increase in the total rate. The increase in the State law is the only cause of the increase.
