

In that address to Congress August 29, 1916 the President made six a commendations for legislation: First, the enlargement and administrati - reorganization of the Interstate Commerce Commission; Second, the establishment of the eight-hour day as the legal basis for work and wages of all railway employes engaged in interstate trans-portation; Third, the authorization of a small body of men to observe the actual results of the eight-hour day and report to Congress; Fourth, approval of an increase of freight rates to meet such additional expenditures by rem-on on the eight-hour day; Fifth, an a unendment of the xisting Federal statute which provides for mediation, conciliation and a bitration of such controversies as the President by adding to it a provision that in case the methods of accomodation now provided for should fail, a full public investigation of the merits of every such dispete shall be instituted and completer before a strike or leckout may lawfully be attempted; and, Sixth, Lalement in the bands of the Executive of the power, in case of military necessity, to take control of the railways for military service.
