Law School Tax in Lexington
In the recent statistical report of M. B. Fowler, business manager of the Durham city schools has stated that Lexington gets more per dollar for school fund than do the citizens of any other of the twenty-five leading cities of the State.
In these twenty-five cities the average cost per pupil of the conduct of the schools is \$41 per year. The cost in Lexington is \$26.89 or 14.11 below the state average. Lexington's per capita cost is also lower by over three dollars per pupil than any other city in the State. The nearest approach is Henderson, which spends \$29.95 per pupil per year.
