Sold by leading druggists. DEFICIT FOR 1923 INCREASED \$167,000,000 TO \$484,000,000

Washington, May 3.—While Republicans are claiming that the administration is making savings, Secretary of the Treasury Mellon in an official statement shows that the estimates of deficits are steadily increasing. One of the wildest statements concerning Republican economy was recently published in the press and attributed to Senator Lodge, leader of the Republican party in the senate.

Senator Pat Harrison, Democrat of Mississippi, called the attention of the senate to this error published all over the country and also exposed the false claims of the junior senator from Ohio (Mr. Willis) in a recent New York speech. "In the course of his (Senator Lodge's) speech," said Senator Harrison, "which was carried in all the press of the country, he made the statement that appropriations of \$5,337,000,000 asked by the departments have been cut out to \$1,428,000,000. Whether he made that statement or not I do not know. Of course, he was speaking as a candidate and laboring under the enthusiasm of speaking to his constituents and it was but natural that he should get his figures a little confused. Whether he made the statement or not, the papers carried it that way."

Senator Lodge said there was an error of one word in the statement which he corrected on the floor and in the permanent record, but admitted that the papers carried his statement wrong.

Senator Harrison said many grossly exaggerated claims have been made. He called attention to the speech of Senator Willis, of Ohio, making claim to big changes and big cuts and then referred to the letter from Secretary of the Treasury Mellon to Senator McCumber saying that the estimates of \$167,000,000 deficit for 1923 have increased "under the alleged splendid management of the new administration" to \$484,000,000, which the senator thought might be more when the true facts are known.

Saying that Secretary Mellon attributed the increased deficit to the falling off of the income tax, Senator Harrison added: "I think that is true. There is depression everywhere. Nobody is making any money scarcely under the promised prosperity under this administration. So it is perfectly natural that incomes should be greatly diminished. You, who have been laying and may in the future lay large claims of savings, should study the deficits and remember this report of the secretary of the treasury."

ORANGES, LEMONS AND BANANAS IN SAMPSON

Miss Mary Moore, on a farm in Sampson county, has managed to grow oranges, lemons and bananas successfully, and expects soon to have a supply for home use. The trees are cared for in the winter season by covering them with canvas, which is removed at the approach of warm weather in order to admit the sunlight. Miss Moore has produced some fine specimens of these fruits, and has demonstrated that any family can have the same right in its own front yard if willing to take the time and care necessary.

Mr. O. Max Gardner's withdrawal from the gubernatorial campaign has proven to his many friends his keen sense of honor and right. The election of Hon. Cameron Morrison from the western section of North Carolina has according to procedure left the government to the eastern section of the state. Mr. Gardner's announcement that he will be in the race in 1922 is no surprise to this great state of ours.

Having advertised his Ford car for sale, Mr. O. L. Shugrue, of Charlotte, was called out of town and left the sale of the car to his wife. A man and his wife called to look at the car, drove it out of the garage, and stating that they liked it, asked permission to drive the car around the block. Mrs. Shugrue granted this permission and the couple drove around the block. They however, returned with the car. The man is described by Mrs. Shugrue as being short, with dark complexion, brown eyes and nose, and wearing a suit and tie. He was accompanied by a woman.

POSTAL IMPROVEMENT WEEK IS OBSERVED

May 1 Sees Inaugurated First General Campaign of Kind in Service.

Without the Postal Service, business would languish in a day, and be at a standstill in a week. Public opinion would die of dry rot. Sectional hatred or prejudice only would flourish, and narrow-mindedness thrive.

It is the biggest distinctive business in the world and it comes nearer to the innermost interests of a greater number of men and women than any other institution on earth. No private business, however widespread, touches so many lives so often or so sharply; no church reaches into so many souls, flutters so many pulses, has so many human beings dependent on its ministrations.

"Postal Improvement Week" has been set for May 1, by the Postmaster General. This is the first general campaign of its kind in the Postal Service for several decades. Business men and their organizations, large users of the mail, newspapers, motion pictures, advertisers, and the entire organization of 326,000 postal workers are to be enlisted in this country-wide campaign of interest in postal improvements. Your help is vital. Address your letters plainly with pen or typewriter. Give street address. Spell out name of State, don't abbreviate. Put your return address in the upper left hand corner of envelope (not on the back) and always look at your letter before dropping in the mail to see if it is properly addressed. This care in the use of the mails is for your benefit and speeds up the dispatch and delivery of mail matter.

If you have any complaints of poor service make them to your postmaster. He has instructions to investigate them and report to the department.
