BILL BY MR. MOSER

Representative I. C. Moser has introduced a bill in the House to increase the number of county commissioners of Randolph county to five; to confer upon the board of county commissioners the functions of the board of road trustees; and to abolish the board of road trustees of Randolph county.

Asheboro needs a public library, and there is no reason why we should not have one. Other towns, smaller than Asheboro and with less resources than ours boast of public libraries.

The free seed appropriation has been killed in congress and after this year there will be no more free seeds. Senator Lodge has advocated the abolishing of free seeds from time to time and it has at last been brought about.

The disastrous fire which destroyed the administration building at Elon College is a distinct loss. The members of the Christian Church will no doubt rally as one man to the rebuilding.

A touching scene was enacted in the House of Representatives recently when Major Charles M. Stedman, the distinguished North Carolinian, the last Confederate veteran in Congress, introduced a bill giving permission to the Daughters to erect in one of the public parks of the District of Columbia, a monument commemorating the services of the negro "Mammies" of the South.

Congressman Wm. C. Hammer has introduced a bill in the House of Representatives increasing the appropriation for the construction of a postoffice building at Thomasville from \$55,000 to \$85,000.

During last year fifty three counties in North Carolina were organized for demonstration work Randolph county has a farm demonstration agent and should be thoroughly organized along the line of home demonstration work.
