Sunday's News and Observer carried quite a lengthy article concerning the lighting of cars, mentioning the fact that very few cars are equipped with the regulation two front lights and a tail light.

There is a N. C. Law, Section 2615 Consolidated Statutes which says, during the period from one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise every motor vehicle operated or driven upon the public highways of this state shall display at least two lighted lamps on the front, and shall display a red light visible from the rear.
