The Republicans of Iredell county passed resolutions endorsing the administration of President Coolidge, but refused to go on record as giving specific endorsement to the administration's anti-bonus policy. The consensus of opinion was that our government would and should give the bonus matter due consideration when the country's financial condition is improved.
