Not only did the deficiency bill go down in defeat in the race against time, but a special resolution passed in the last minutes by the house to make the bonus appropriation available regardless, lost in the senate. Many other measures, including the bill authorizing construction of eight new cruisers and the remodeling of several battleships and the deficiency appropriation bill carrying funds to begin operation of the bonus law and for many other purposes failed in the final crash which automatically ended at 7 p. m.


