**THE SIXTY-EIGHT CONGRESS ADJOURNED SATURDAY NIGHT**

Congress ended its six-month session last Saturday night, June 7th in a great turmoil, western senators and representatives in the last hours of the session fought and lost a desperate fight to relieve the farmer and to reform the reclamation policy of the government. Not only did the deficiency bill go down in defeat in the race against time, but a special resolution passed in the last minutes by the house to make the bonus appropriation available regardless, was lost in the senate.

Many other measures, including the bill authorizing construction of eight new cruisers and the remodeling of several battleships and the deficiency appropriation bill carrying funds to begin operation of the bonus law and for many other purposes failed in the final crash which automatically ended at 7 p. m.

**MURDERS FORTY CHILDREN**

Nikolai Zukor, a trainer of police dogs, of Venia, has been taken into custody charged with the murder of forty children ranging from ten to thirteen years of age. Zukor, taking advantage of the plight of starving peasants, induced the parents to give him their children, especially girls. He promised homes for the unfortunate children where they would be clothed and well fed. When some of the parents suddenly appeared at the home of Zukor to see their children they were informed that the families to which the girls had been assigned had moved to other parts of the country. One mother of a little ten year old girl saw some of her child's wearing apparel hanging in Zukora room and immediately demanded police authorities to make a search of the premises. The bodies of eighteen girls were found in one room. The remains of seven boys were found in the garden. A preliminary hearing developed that Zukor had murdered forty children since last June. The girls had first been outraged.
