Change in Style of Money The only bills of the "Series of 1923" issued by the Treasury department up into circulation so far are the one-dollar certificates and the one-dollar United States notes. In the old bills the seal of the Treasury appeared in blue, except for the gold certificates, on which the seal was yellow. For the series 1923 the seal is changed from the right-hand side of the bill to the left, and the denominational figure is placed on the right-hand side. On all the new bills, regardless of the denomination, the seal, the denominational figure and the number of the bill will be printed in colors as follows: Blue for silver certificates; red for United States notes; green for Federal Reserve notes; brown for National Bank notes; and yellow for gold certificates. The new two-dollar bills will have the portrait of Jefferson in the center.
