RAILROADS ARE ESTABLISHING NEW TRAFFIC RECORDS

Reports to the Interstate Commerce Commission indicate that American railroads will establish new freight carrying records this year. Up to the week ending May 9, loadings exceeded the previous banner year of 1923 by 430,000 cars, and the same period in 1924 by 550,000 cars. If the present rate of traffic holds up the railroads will have loaded 50,-000,000 cars this year, the first time in the history of the country.

Since January 1st, 1923, the railroads have added nearly 400,000 new freight cars. Most of these cars are Miss Lona Farlow, who is well of the large type carrying 50 tons and upward. In the past year 6,700 locomotives have been purchased and orders for over 300 are now being
