Fire Loss in State Shows Large Increase

Fire loss in North Carolina during the month of August showed a substantial increase over August last year. Fire loss the past month was \$361,982 as compared with \$212,820 in August, 1924.

Of these 213 fires, 59 were in tobacco curing barns and tobacco pack houses. There was a large increase in the number of automobiles burned in the rural sections.

There were during the month ten fires with a loss of more than \$5000. The total loss in ten fires was more than \$200,000.

Among the towns having no fire loss during the month were Aberdeen, Albemarle, Sanford, Thomasville and Pinehurst.
